School information

School system in Scotland:

• **Pre-school/Nursery** (3 to 4/5 year-old)

- **Primary School** (4/5 to 10/11 year-old). Goes from Primary one (P1) to primary seven (P7).
- **Secondary School** (11 to 17/18 year-old). Goes from first year (S1) to sixth year (S6).

Term dates:

- A school year starts around the middle of August and finishes towards the end of June.
- 3 terms (Autumn, Spring and Summer)
- Mid-term breaks
- Summer break

3 easy steps:

- Find schools in your catchment area
- Chose one school
- Make contact with the school directly to check if they have space for your child and find out about registration.

To find out about schools in your area and how to register your kids in your local school, please contact the city of Edinburgh Council www.edinburgh.gov.uk/info/878/schools

Every school has a catchment area around it. Children living in this area are given priority for places in this school (usually 2 catchment schools per address). To find out about your catchment schools you can email school.catchments@edinburgh.gov.uk

School is free and is compulsory until the age of 16.

English as Additional Language (EAL) service

What does EAL do?

- provide language support through the curriculum
- advise schools on teaching bilingual pupils
- support schools to create a culturally inclusive ethos and to promote equality of opportunity

How can EAL help you?

EAL Teachers are qualified teachers who are experienced in working with bilingual children and their families

Bilingual Support Assistants/ Bilingual Nursery Nurse provide support for pupils in the home language and English (Arabic, Bengali, Cantonese, Mandarin, Polish, Urdu) and can help with home-school communication and cultural matters

When you make contact with the school you can ask for an interpreter (if you need one) or ask if you and your child can meet the EAL Teacher.

The school and EAL Teacher can:

- give you more detailed information about the education system, the curriculum and practicalities, e.g. arrangements for eating, school uniform etc.
- answer any questions you have
- explain how to communicate with your child's teachers

You can help the school and EAL Teacher by:

- sharing information about your child's previous education and learning
- keeping in good contact with the school
