







Grade 9 Senior Research Fellow

- Carry out independent research, consistent with the research strategy of the School/Institute, acting for some projects as principal investigator and project leader and, where appropriate, lead a research team, or otherwise contribute to research leadership within the School.
- Determine relevant research objectives, prepare research proposals, identify sources of research funding and, where necessary actively seek research funding and secure it as far as it is reasonably possible.
- Make presentations or exhibitions at national and international conferences, and other similar events.

- with substantial international circulation.



Initiative, problem-solving and decision-making

Grade 9 Senior Research Fellow

- Contribute to decisions which have an impact on other related programmes.
- Provide advice on issues such as ensuring the adequate balance of research projects, appointment of researchers and other performance matters.
- Spotting opportunities for strategic development of new projects or appropriate areas of activity and contributing to the development of such ideas.

Grade 10 Professorial Fellow

- Determine the final allocation of resources within own area of responsibility.
- Act as the final arbiter in local disputes.
- Be party to strategic decisions at Institutional level
- Lead the development of new and creative approaches in responding to research and commercial challenges.




